Kristia Ningsih awarded an SPIE Optics and Photonics Scholarship

BELLINGHAM, Washington, USA — **Kristia Ningsih** has been awarded a 2025 Optics and Photonics Scholarship by SPIE, the international society for optics and photonics, for potential contributions to optics, photonics, or a related field.



Ningsih is a PhD candidate in optics and photonics at the University of Sydney, also funded by the Australia Awards Scholarship. Under Professor **Benjamin Eggleton**, she develops chip-based, ultra-narrowband optical filters using Brillouin Dynamic Gratings for tunable signal processing in sensing and communication. Alongside her work, Ningsih is also president of the SPIE Student Chapter, leading technical workshops and outreach programs that encourage students to explore careers in physics, particularly in optics and photonics. Originally from Indonesia, Ningsih is passionate about bridging advanced photonics research with real-world impact, especially in underserved communities, through education and science engagement.

This month, the Society is awarding \$323,000 in scholarships to 74 outstanding SPIE Student Members, based on their potential contribution to optics and photonics, or a related discipline. Successful applicants were evaluated, selected, and approved by the SPIE Scholarship Committee, chaired by SPIE Senior Member **Brian Primeau**.

Since this program began in 1978, SPIE has distributed more than \$7.5 million dollars in individual scholarships. This ambitious effort reflects the Society's commitment to education as well as to the future generations of optical scientists and engineers around the world.
